Drama Beyond the Classroom Programme, May 2024

Lanka Children's and Youth Theatre Foundation (LCYTF):

In 1981 Somalatha Subasinghe founded the Lanka Children's and Youth Theatre Foundation (LCYTF) and Somalatha Subasinghe Play House, the theatre production and training arm of LCYTF, to promote theatre production and performances specifically for children and youth, training of actors, and research on theatre studies. Since 1981 the organisation has produced a repertoire of mainly musical theatre for children and youth and award-winning mainstream art theatre productions and performed them in the island as well as abroad. In January 2007, this institution was incorporated in the parliament under the Act No. 3 of 2007. At present LCYTF is the topmost institution for children and youth theatre productions in Sri Lanka.

Introduction:

The prime objective of the programme is to make drama and theatre learning an enjoyable experience for the participating children. All aspects of drama and theatre are presented to the child in an easy-to-understand way so that the artistic taste, cheerfulness and playful sense of the child is enhanced. The programme is based on created activities, and they give the child the opportunity to experience the most important learning outcomes of drama and theatre such as sense of caring, world awareness, experience in human relationships and socio-cultural values, a sense of basic art forms and more importantly confidence and dignity.

To Whom:

The programme is designed primarily for grade eight to eleven children who offer drama and theatre as a subject at school. However, since the programme is activity-based any students who has the knack to be creative and adventurous too can join the programme. For such students the activities of the programme can be considered supplementary to the formal education the child obtains in schools.

Learning Outcome:

This programme gives the child the opportunity to learn and understand the basics of

- (i) the origin, the nature and different styles of theatre
- (ii) different methods of drama acting
- (iii) free and structured movements as an alternative method of expression
- (iv) music appreciation and singing
- (v) Art, handicrafts and puppetry, and
- (vi) language proficiency.

Resource Persons:

The programme is conducted by Prof. Chandana Aluthge and Playwright and Actor Nilanka Dahanayake. In addition, artistes/drama teachers who have obtained special training to work with children too are assisting the programme delivery.

Duration and Time:

The programme has three terms a year from January to March, May to July and September to November. Students can join in to the programme in any term as each term stands on its own. Participating children can continue the programme until they reach GCE O/L. The teaching and learning objective of the programme is in line with the drama and theatre national curriculum from grade 7 to GCE O/L.

Registration of students for the programme is done on first come-first served basis.

Programme is held on Saturdays from 11.15 am to 2.15 pm. One term consists of twelve three-hour consecutive sessions on Saturdays.

The programme commences on 4th May 2024.

Participating children are kindly requested to bring their food and drinks. Children should be provided with suitable clothing (preferably loose garments) to take part in drama and theatre Session.

Fee:

The fee for the programme is Rs. 6000/= per child per term plus a onetime registration fee of Rs. 500/=. Parents are kindly requested to pay the total tuition fee (Rs. 6500/=) in one instalment at registration.
